I'm pleased to advise that Stu Savill, Chair of Cheam Squash Club, is happy (you know what I mean) to take on the role of Treasurer. He is nominated by Colin Hillier and seconded by Alan Rankin.
- 5) We'd appreciate you giving a "yes" to points 3 and 4 above. You can also say "no" but we would then expect someone doing so to put themselves forward for one of the roles.

ACCOUNTS

As always, I'd like to thank Michael Gallant and Jo Bareham for their hard work in preparing the Accounts and their invaluable input to all matters financial. In summary, an encouraging set of Accounts although one month was "lost" due to the first lockdown. You will see that the reduction in maintenance costs was offset by a rise in rates following the removal of our rates relief.

However, I'm pleased to tell you that our appeal against the removal of rates relief was upheld by the Council last week and we will shortly be receiving a refund of about £7,000 covering 2019/2020. That figure is the maximum relief available and should remain in place for the next few years until the next review is undertaken.

Everything else on the 2019/2020 Accounts is just about in line with what we expected albeit Lockdown 1 did take away that crucial month of Clubhouse income, not just the bar but also hall hire.

So, although this "AGM" is all about 2019/2020, I know you will want to know where we are now, particularly as we near our financial year end for 2020/2021.

I'm pleased to advise that we are in a decent place. We have used the furlough scheme to look after the staff, both permanent and our group of casuals. The removal of business rates has been essential and we have also applied successfully for several grants.

I would like to pay a huge thank you on behalf of us all to Mike Gallant (our finance guru) Jo Bareham (our fabulous book keeper) and Colin Hillier (Secretary) for all their hard work on this and helping us look to the summer with peace of mind on the financial front. Derry Brophy (Chair of Cheam Hockey Club) has also done some excellent work with regards to some of our utility bills and that should kick in very soon.

We know there was success and achievement in all our main sports (bowls, cricket, football, korfball, squash and tennis) and well done to all concerned. However, there was one achievement which I think trumps everything else...drumroll please!

Cheam Cricket Club. Wow! All 4 Saturday XIs won promotion in their leagues, two teams as champions.

As I said, lots of success in all our sports but I hope you'll agree Cheam CC deserve a special mention. Congratulations also to Cheam Hockey Club who, like the Sports Club, has reached its 100th year. Few party like our hockey players so we'll gauge the feel for a belated

centenary celebration for us all in the next few months, let us know what you think. I sense we're all in need of some kind of party when the time is right.

I'll end now because we need to start looking forwards and I think this coming year more than ever we need everyone and every sport to work together. Please always bear in mind that much if not most of what you see at Cheam Sports Club is down to volunteers and everyone is doing their best. It's not always perfect but it's not bad is it?
